I have received your letters up to, and including Feb. 26. We seem to be having better luck now, with our mail.

Concerning my letters, if for some time to come my letters become fewer and briefer, think nothing of it, for it is because of the lack of stationery (this is borrowed). We have only our combat roll with us, in it we are allowed only the bare essentials, stationery <sup>not</sup> being one of them. So until we get to our stationery our letters will have to be scarcer.

Nothing new, we did weather our first air raid. Nothing so exciting. No one was hurt, and no damage done except to some of the enemy planes.

a fellow can say. But the  
main purpose of this letter  
is to let you know I'm still  
around, and in good health.
